

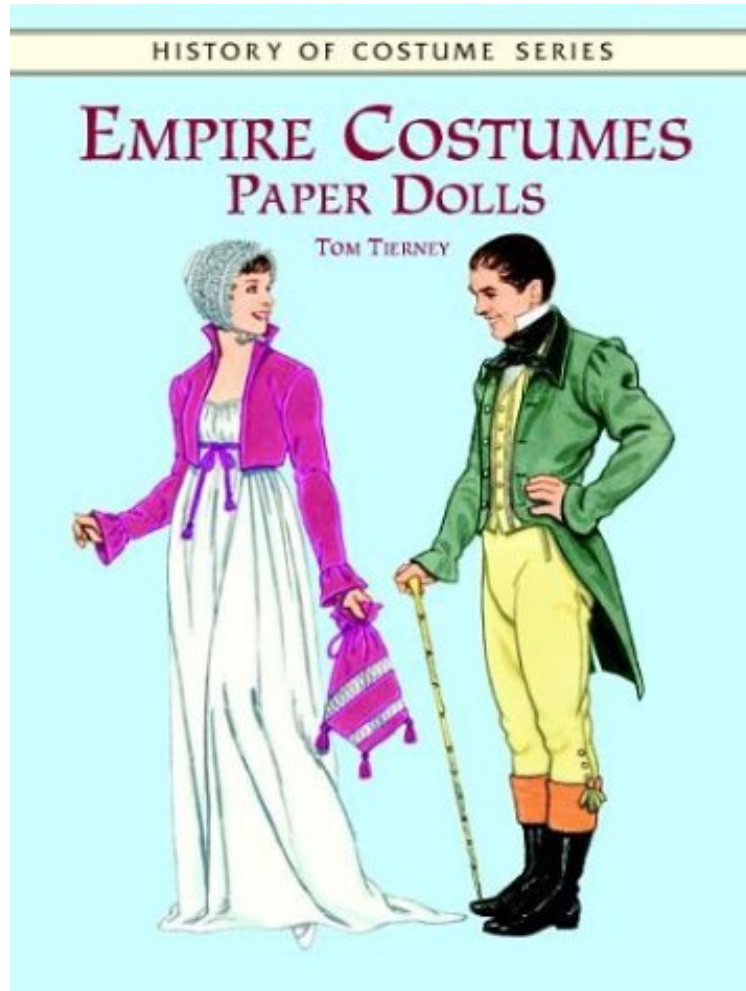

His models display the styles of France in the years 1800-15, when the "merveilluses" set the fashion for classical costume among women and the neoclassicists (who introduced pantaloons and trousers) and "incroyables" competed to serve as the trendsetters for men. The clothes include tailcoats, abbreviated spencer jackets, bicornes and top hats for men and close-fitting caps or brimmed hats or bonnets for women, checkered waistcoats and high cravats. Though not in the "History of Costume" series, Tierney's Fashions of the Regency Period Paper Dolls is drawn on the same scale and can and should be used with its counterpart.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
