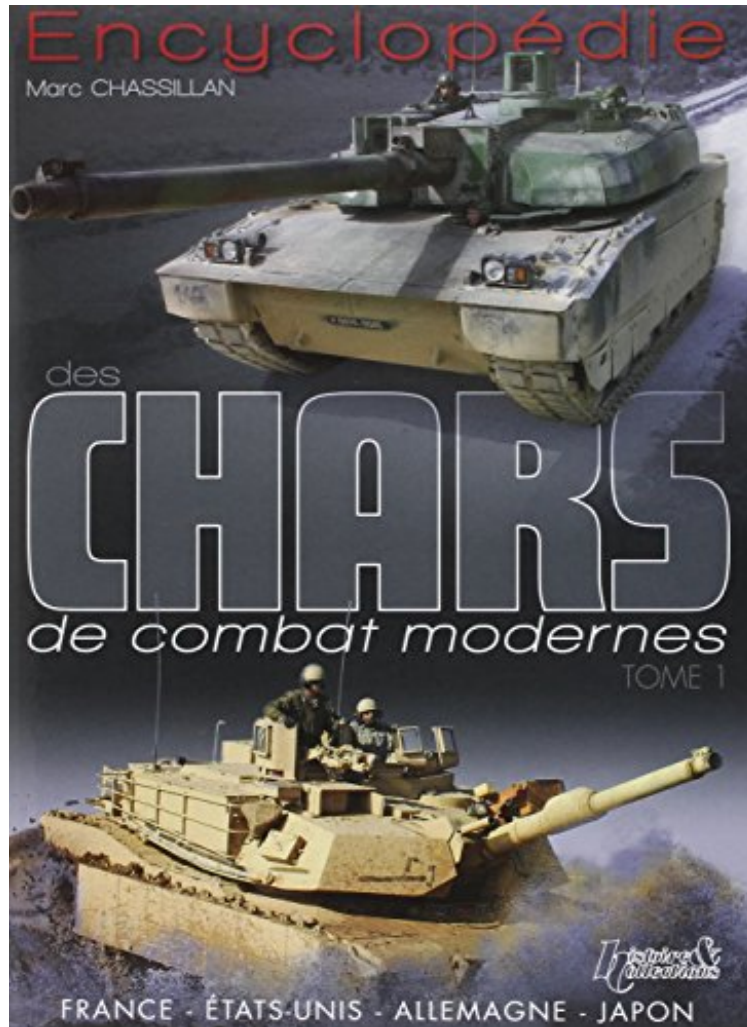

I have deliberately given it a low rating to try and persuade HC that they should still do an English-language edition (which was actually originally announced, and which I had ordered through) of both this and the companion volume.It is sheer stupidity to do a book that contains information on U.S. tanks and not do an English-language edition! In fact, as an encyclopedia,

it should have been done in English anyway. HC needs to realize that, on a worldwide basis, they are likely to sell far more books in English than in French. They continue to make peculiar decisions as to which books to do in English. Books on entirely French subjects can be done only in French, but any volume with international appeal should also be done in English.
