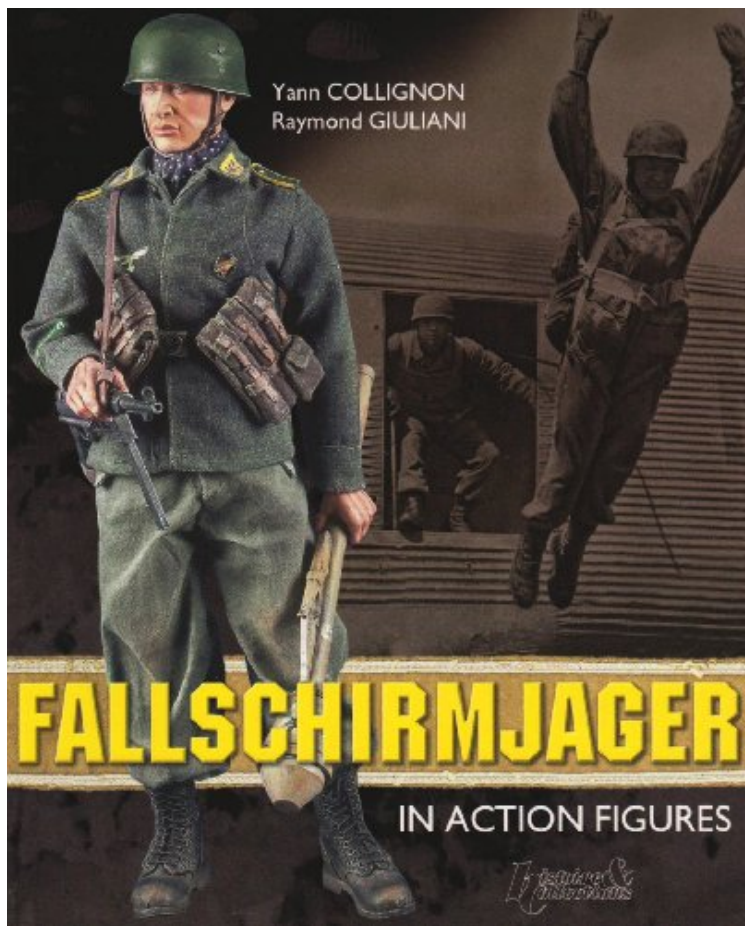

This book is more a history of the Axis airborne forces than a how to guide for 1/6 action figures. The text describes airborne operations not the figures, the figures are described in the photo captions. They don't give much info on how the figures were made or what parts were used. The figures are well done and include Italian and Japanese paras. It's well worth the modest price for the figures alone.

Among all the German elite forces, the Green Devils distinguished themselves, from the early stages of WWII, by their feats, their esprit-de-corps and a chivalry towards their adversaries.
