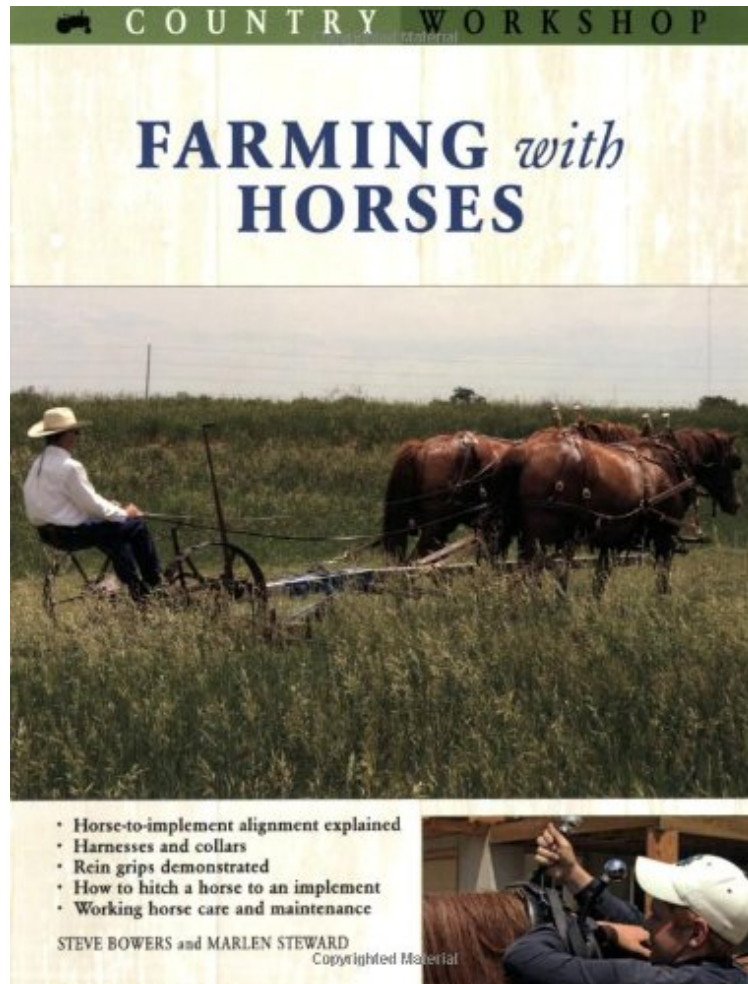

The high-quality photos are excellent, and the text is well-written and easy to understand. There is very good information here which is not to be found in other books on draft horses. This book does not really teach how to farm with horses, but it does teach you everything you need to know before you actually go out and plow a field. I would like to see a sequel which goes into actual farming with horses. This is a very useful book.
