

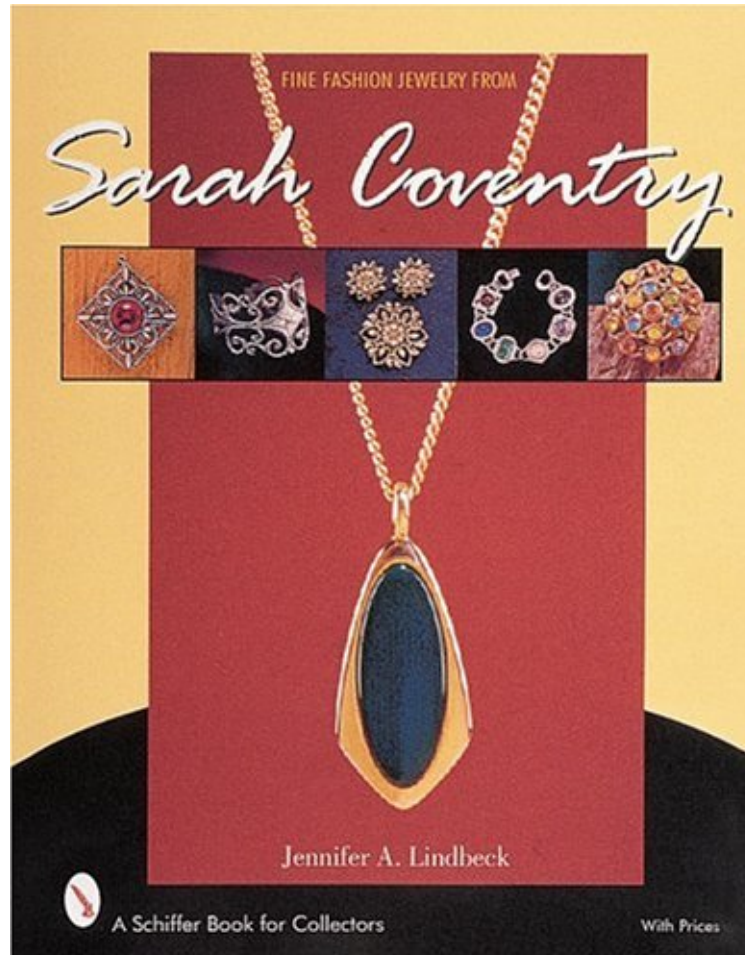

Less than 10% of the pieces are identified...and some of them improperly. One of the most iconic designs, "Midnight Magic" is identified as "Midnight Madness", twice. The "Pearl Flight" pin is described as a 'shell design pin'. Most pieces are simply described, for example, as 'necklace and matching bracelet.' No dates are referenced. A tremendous disappointment. You can learn much more about Sarah Coventry jewelry on ebay and Google. One plus...it's a great workbook for writing in your own identifications and catching the author's errors ;-)

It has many lovely pictures, but hardly any names for the jewelry pieces shown. Since Sarah Coventry named so many of their items, I think it is necessary to have those names associated with the pieces. It does me no good to see a picture of what I already have and still cannot name it. The most helpful part of this book is in the back where the author has pictures of Sarah's catalog pages 1976, 1978, and 1980. Jewelry can be identified there if you have a magnifying glass.
