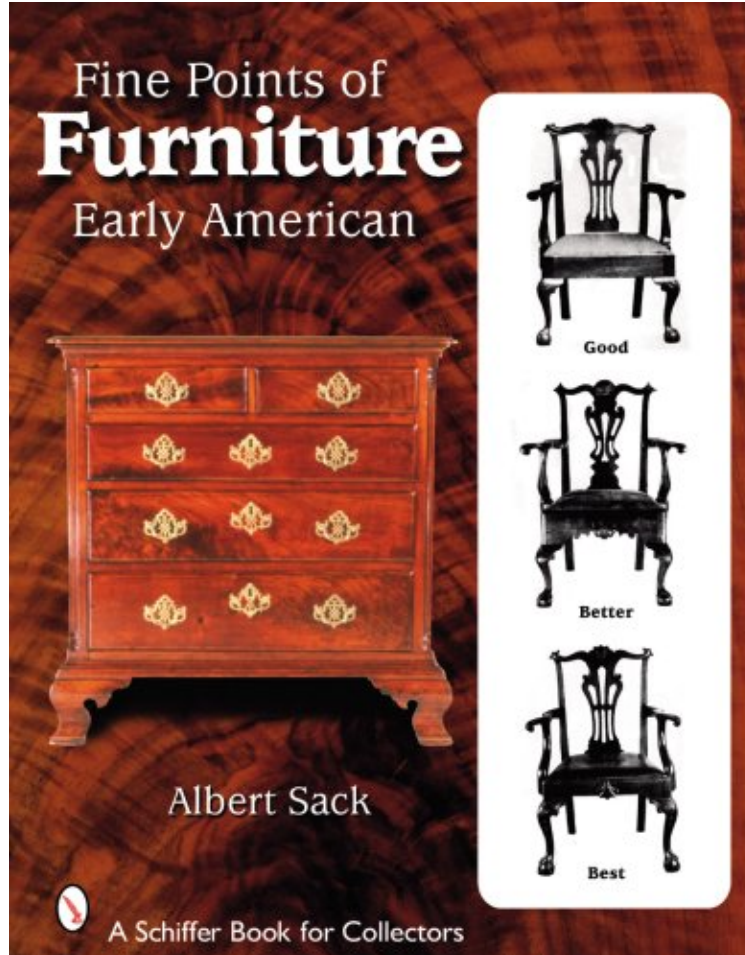

I found this version much more informative than the later version since he is much more blunt and gives clearer indications of why the good pieces are not up to par with the "better" and "best" ones. The new version has some color pics and a broader range of catagories but he toned down his commentary in a way that made it harder to tell why one piece was better than another. It does not have a glossary of terms, so I did have to go to other books and a dictionary for some descriptive words he uses, but I was able to figure out many of them because they were used so often with
