The last is a Cosway Binding of 1928.In this work Nixon aimed toOnly discuss bindings not published in book form beforeAim for a reasonable coverage of all patriots of bookbinding (some area had been well covered in early major works on English Bookbinding). The earliest binding is on the Stonyhurst St. Cuthbert's Gospels -- this is not included as it and a number of important bindings have been previously publishedHe aimed to add at least one new fact on each bindingA number of bindings were made for Royalty or Rulers including Henry VIII, Edward VI , Queen Mary along with Elizabeth I and later Oliver Cromwell Charles II and George IIIOther binding were made for important nobles and also bookcollectorsArchbishop Parker, Lord Burghley, and Lord Herbert feature as does Samuel Peyps. Later there is a binding for the famous Harleian LibraryOne meets a range of bookbinders-- some we know about while others are known to us buy those whose book they boundThe format is comment on the Left side of the page with notes where needed and a well reproduced full page BW illustration on the RightI tend to dip into it and look at the Bindings and read the commentary on selected bindingsIf you are interested in
