

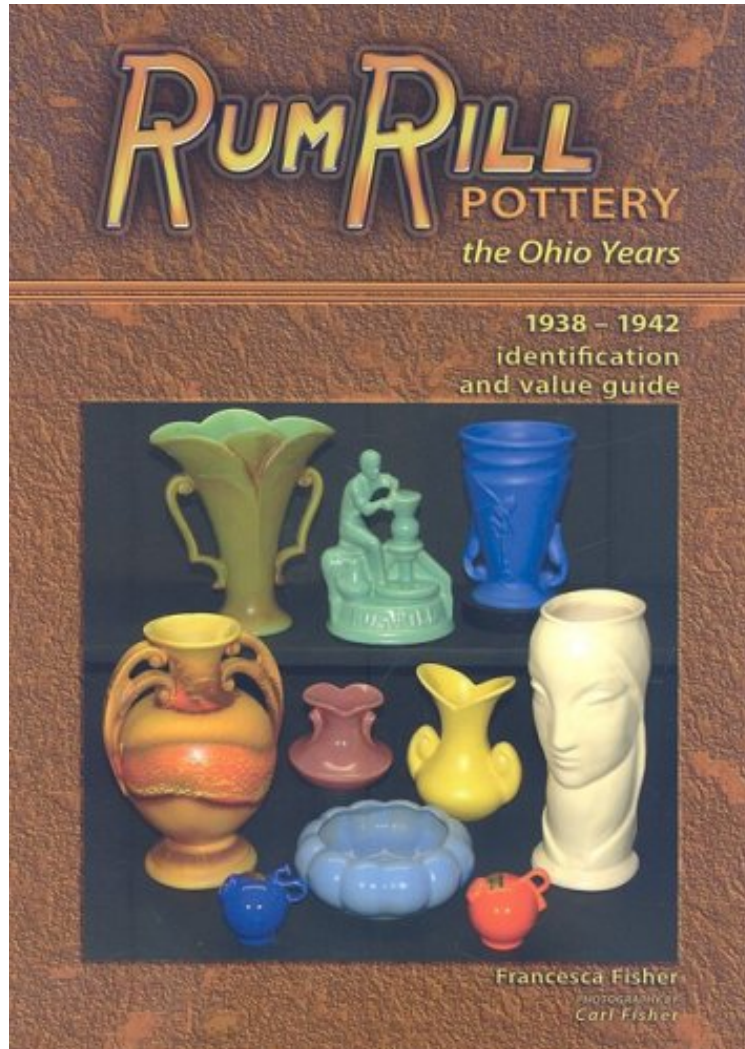

RumRill Pottery: The Ohio Years, 1938 - 1942, explores the post Red Wing-made RumRill that was manufactured at Mt. Gilead and Zanesville, Ohio. Identify your unmarked pieces, view never before seen catalogs, and learn the history behind this little known Ohio pottery that is soon to become a collector's favorite. This book features hundreds of full-color photos, lots of rare pieces, and includes in-depth interviews with people that used to work at the Florence Pottery Company. 2008 values.

This title covers the very brief period from 1938 to 1942 when George Rumrill produced his pottery in Ohio. (Prior to that time, it had been produced for Rumrill by the Red Wing pottery in Minnesota for 6 years.) An extensive history of the company is included, as are dozens of catalog pages.
