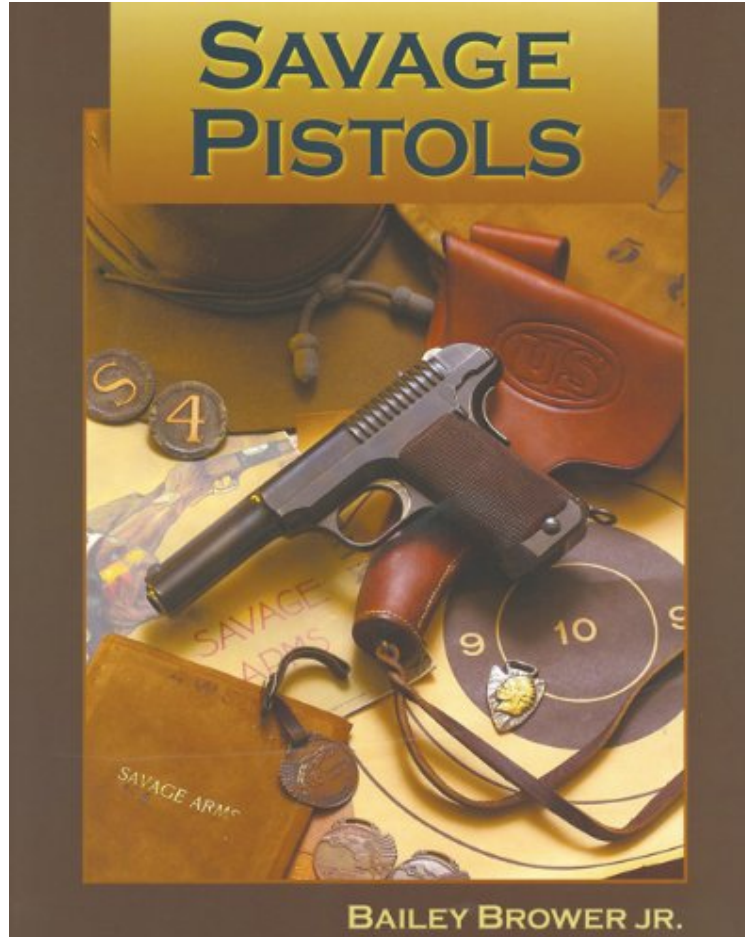

After owning it a short time, I decided as I always do that I needed to know more of the history of the gun. Searching available sources, I found that only two quality reference books were available, one being out of print and quite expensive. I bought Bailey Brower's book and was extremely impressed. The quality of the book is exceptional in both the paper and the binding. The photography is top-notch. The data itself seems to be complete and well organized. A great amount of early history of Savage Arms and the development of the pistols is included, and I learned a great deal of new information on the 1899 series of rifles as well. Overall, I can give this book a 5 Star rating and recommend it as a reference in any gun afficianado's gun reference library and, with it's relatively modest pricing, I'm buying a second copy for a friend. While Carr's work (My Bible) was highly technical and a collector's dream, the other book, 10 Shots Quick by Stern was mostly color and background. Brower's book has combined the two and added a few new facts and areas of particular interest to collectors, like the boxes and many other things. While some of the production figures are at odds with Carr's, which is normal for later authors, one can only hope he has done his homework and they are more accurate. Always open to debate. Nevertheless, the newest book is a MUST HAVE for Savage collectors and I would recommend it highly to everyone with a interest in the wonderful little guns.
