The introduction and short essay here do a fine job of providing the historical and cultural context of the subjects depicted, which are based on folklore, cultural and religious belief systems. There is also discussion of some of the important collectors who were instrumental in preserving the many examples that make up the bounty of color photographs supplied in this catalog.Do be aware, though, that a few copies of the hardcover edition of this book may likely STILL be available at the Chinese Cultural Center in San Francisco. I was able to purchase a brand-new copy from them at list price just last year.

Among the ceramic sculptures of China, none can surpass the Shiwan figures in terms of modeling, vivid expression, and colorful glazes. This presentation of the Shiwan ceramics features 100 figurines and vessels from American collections dating from the Song dynasty to the present. An appendix includes signatures and seals from the pieces.
