The ribbed basket patterns are beautiful, and under the Plaited Baskets section, the Cherokee Gathering Basket is particularly outstanding. The Finishing Touches section is well-illustrated and one I refer to often.Two things keep me from giving this book five stars: (1) the directions could use improvement in the writing: some steps must be inferred, and some sentences are ambiguous at best.(2) The publisher, Sterling, should have provided a better binding. With even minor use, the pages in the book separate from the spine, so that the user has loose pages floating around the book and falling out of it.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
