

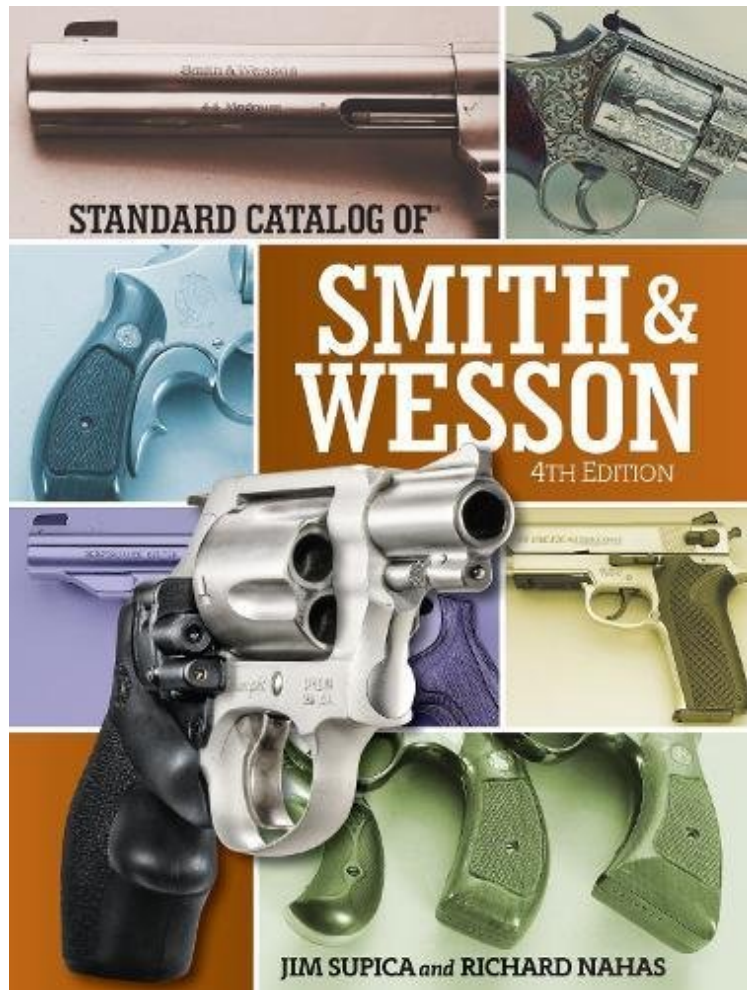

The fourth edition, yes there are section and chapter links, but go to the model list, none. If you want to look up something about a high numbered model, good luck. You will literally have to scroll through 100 pages. This needs fixed an early buyers should be able to download the new fixed version.
