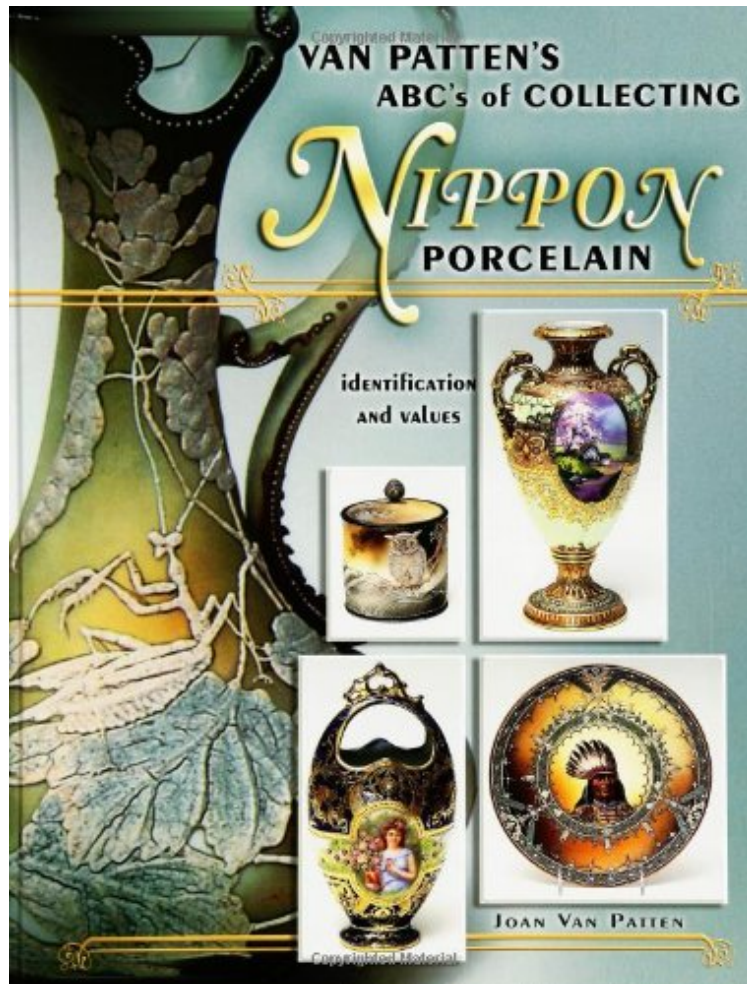

This book provides a firm foundation for anyone who is seriously interested in collecting Nippon. We have only recently begun to collect Nippon items. On a recent antiquing trip, this book was invaluable in helping us make more informed choices. The multitude of marks had us lost in confusion and having found prices all over the place in previous trips, we had no idea of what was reasonable, Van Patten's book cleared all this up. We had been passing up RC Nippon, not realizing that this maker made some of the best quality products, nor did we know that the maple leaf

mark was Morimura, the precursor of Noritaki. The extensive images of the various marks helped us identify better quality pieces and even helped us recognize fakes. This book includes a huge photographic section of both real and fake pieces. In addition, we were amazed at the variety of styles Nippon embraced. Suddenly we found numerous items we completely ignored before. Having this book as a reference, we each made decisions on which products we preferred to focus, and to address the prices with the vendors. We both found chocolate sets, one by RC the other in cobalt by Morimura (1890's), in excellent condition and at prices below market value. We returned home feeling very pleased with our purchases, and recognized that we did so well only because of Van Patten's book. Historical information is included in this new volume Van Patten's ABC's of Collecting Nippon Porcelain, as well as the different designs and techniques that were used. A variety of patterns, designs, decors, and various scenes are showcased. A big chapter on reproductions is also included, and hundreds of backstamps are shown. As the subtitle of the book suggests, this volume is arranged alphabetically by piece. As always, current collector values are provided for every item shown. Hundreds of photographs of vases, tea sets, candlesticks, trays, creamers, plates, urns, and many other types of dishes are featured. Joan Van Patten, co-founder and past president of the International Nippon Collector's Club, is a qualified, trustworthy source for every Nippon collector, and her books are always considered required reading.
