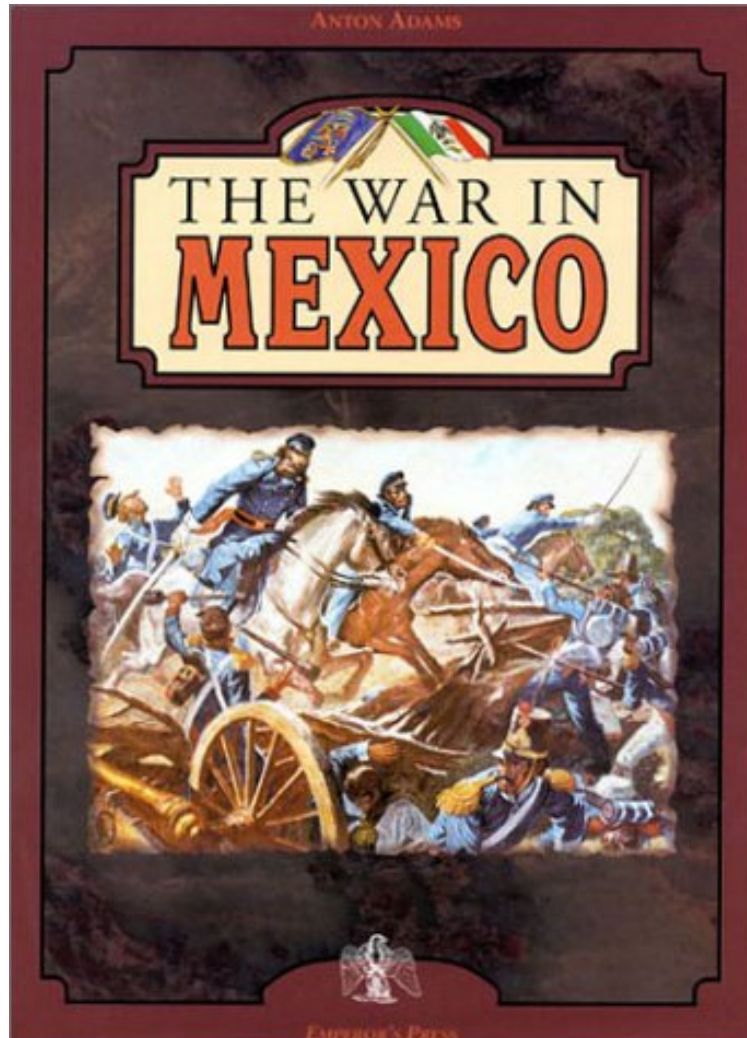

The outstanding features of the book are the charts that list the roster of units for each side for the significant battles, really a sign of outstanding research. Also there are maps of all the major battle, very simple maps but they really help gain a better understanding of the ground and positions of each army. This is the best source i have found on the MAW. It is a pleasant read packed full of information.

The year was 1846, and the war was between the United States and Mexico. The War in Mexico includes descriptions of all the major campaigns and many minor ones, battlefield maps; complete orders of battles of both sides; studies of the American and much misunderstood Mexican armies; 16 color pages of uniforms and flags; and biographical details of the officers who fought in Mexico. To understand the generals of the American Civil War, look to the war where they learned their trade. The future generals of the North and South served their apprenticeship in Mexico as junior officers fighting together for a common cause. This war would determine the border between two nations
