

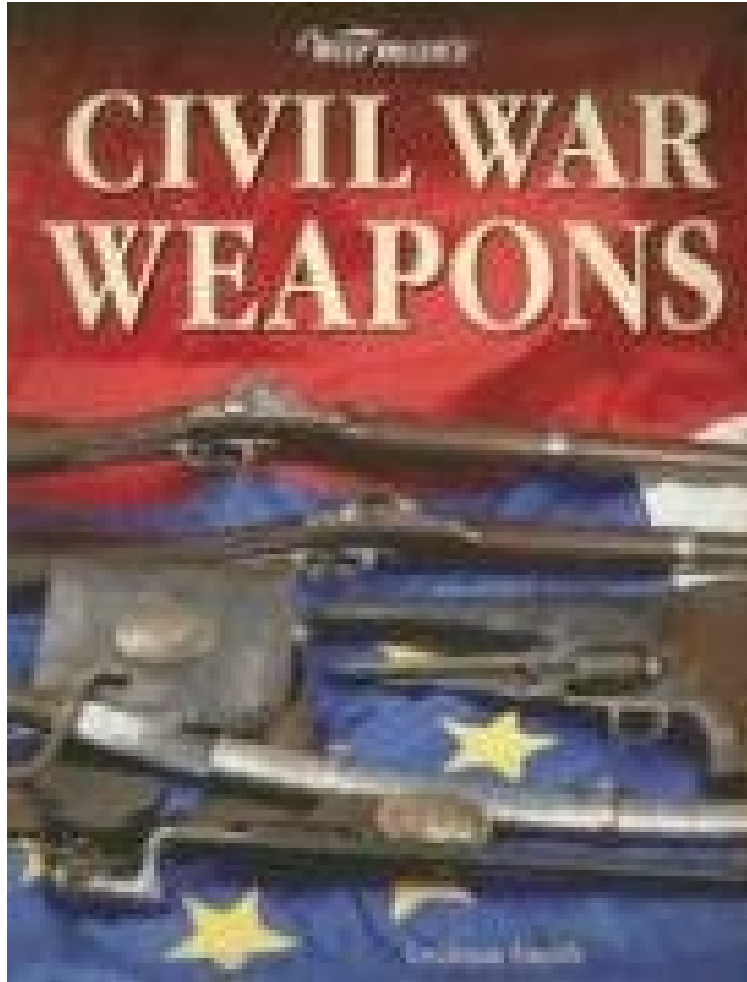

Not ReliableBy Craig Lee BarryWarman's Civil War Weapons is full of the kind of mistakes that make you wince when you read it, for example: The book locates the Springfield Armory in Illinois instead of Massachusetts. It identifies the .58 caliber US Model 1861 as a .64 caliber, and so on. These, and numerous other mistakes in identifying the arms pictured betray the lack of knowledge of the author. In addition he

includes a few tacky, limited edition historical art prints which cheapen the authenticity of the work, or in this case earmark it. However, the photographs of the misidentified historical weapons are very good themselves.

The weapons of the Confederate soldiers and Union Army, a commanding presence 140 years ago, are among today's most revered collectibles. Warman's Civil War Weapons offers Civil War enthusiasts a listing of more than 100 weapons and military vehicles, featured in 400 stunning full-color photos. From the early battles that relied on muzzle-loaded weapons, to the introduction of submarines, handguns, shoulder arms, edged weapons and more, this book chronicles the history of an innovative age of weaponry. Weapons including the Butterfield Revolver, Sharps Model 1859 and Confederate short sword are shown in detail, with a performance summary.
