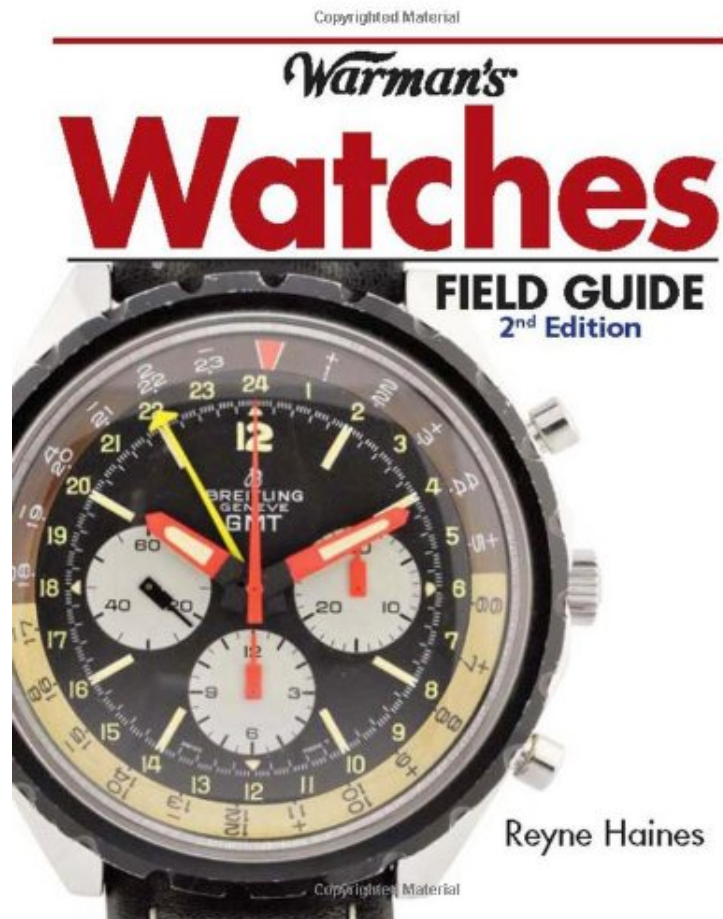

Many important brands were barely represented, such as Ulysse Nardin with 3 watches, or Zenith, with 2 watches. The section on Longines did not even mention the Ultra Chron, for many years their high beat flagship watch. On the other hand for some reason, Gruen had the most representation, with about 80, while Bulova, while represented with 15 watches, did not make it into the index. Most watches had no reference to what years they were made, and the values given, while claimed to be from auctions (what, where?), seemed arbitrary and unreliable.
