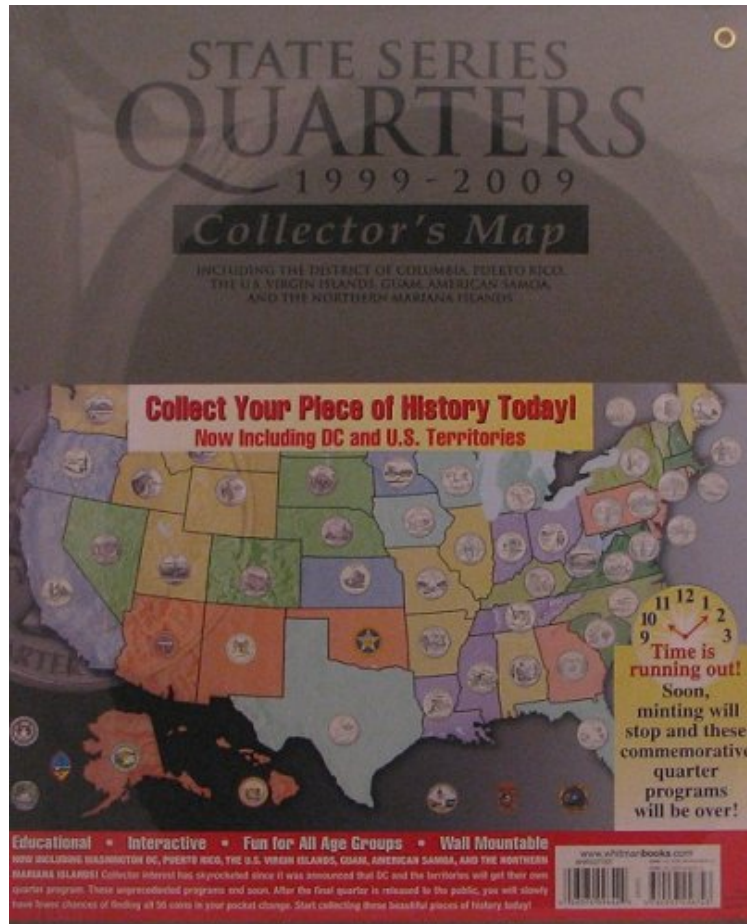

With that said, it is great for adults too, as it doesn't look child-like; it is great for all ages. Once you put the quarter in though, it is tough to get out (you have to pry it out-though it is not impossible), so be sure that if kids are putting them in that you double check first that they are putting the quarter in the right location. Also, this particular map is the best I've seen, and I have seen another one that looks similar, but isn't this one; even when you look at the pictures, two different maps are shown...be sure you are buying the Whitman State Series listed since I notice there are more than one seller. Anyway, have fun, this is really a great purchase, nice quality, not too expensive, and something you could

He had been taping them to the wall before, so when I found this map that would display them on the wall it was perfect.I'm quite pleased with it. I see other people have complained about getting the cardboard place-holders out of the map to put the quarters in. My suggestion is to use a sharp knife and patience. After a learning curve we were able to get them out without damaging the map or anything else (he wanted to keep the cardboard inserts for a separate project). We've not tried to remove any quarters we put in, so I can't vouch for that, but I suspect the knife would work just as well.Great for the money.
